APPENDIX

1. Eligibility:

Visiting Scholars Program candidates should have been serving at their home university for at least three years (before August 1, 2014) as a full time faculty. Scholars who gained their PhD from an institution outside of Asia within the past five years (after 2012) are not eligible. Previous recipients of a Visiting Scholar fellowship from HYI are not eligible to reapply for this program.

Visiting Fellows Program candidates should be doctoral students or junior faculty who are currently working on their dissertation research and writing. Junior faculty members who have already obtained a doctorate are NOT eligible to be nominated for this program. This program is only open to citizens of Asian countries.
